>> HISTORY ABOUT NSHS

In 2004, the school's founding members wanted to provide motivated high school students with a school choice to attend real college classes with help and support as they transition from high school to college. Students finish their high school requirements by passing college courses obtained through dual-credit.

>> IS NSHS FOR YOU?

NSHS is a school of choice, so believing in the core values, mission, and vision is essential before choosing NSHS. Students and parents must be motivated for the student to go to college and willing to work to meet the school's expectations. Committed students will go far!

>> ACTIVITIES

NSHS has a student government that plans and creates school activities, gatherings, prom, and a yearbook. At NSHS, students participate in social events, clubs and activities, and volunteering to give back, stay connected, and build resumes. *NOTE:* Per NRS 386.560, students may request to participate in sports and activities at their zoned school if it is not offered at the charter school.

>> COST

Free for 3-5 college classes each semester. Assistance is also provided for textbooks, bus passes, & ACT/SAT tests.

>> WHAT CLASSES DO STUDENTS TAKE?

College classes are scheduled by the student each semester for 16 weeks (morning, afternoon, night, online classes). NSHS does not offer core classes as these are taken at the colleges for dual-credit. Students start with 3 college classes and earn the privilege to take up to 5 as they show progress at the school.

>> TYPICAL FIRST SEMESTER SCHEDULE (NEW STUDENTS)

1. Intro to College Course (HS) - starts mid-August for two weeks
2. Transitions (HS) - once a month on Fridays
3. Study Skills (HS) - 2 hrs, 2x a week; MW or TR scheduled around college
4. English (College) - based off college placement test & student scheduled
5. Math (College) - based off college placement test & student scheduled
6. U.S. Hist/Govt. (College) - student scheduled

>> SUPPORTS & INTERVENTIONS

NSHS provides academic support and prepares students for life after high school. The school's curriculum is designed around college and career planning and includes: college funding sources, college degree planning, resume and interview development, interventions, test prep and tutoring, college readiness scorecard reports, and more!

>> COLLEGE CREDITS DO TRANSFER

Students are empowered and given the tools to plan for transferring college credits to universities across the U.S. NSHS graduates have attended colleges all over the country and here in Nevada. With careful planning, students can save up to two years of time and money.

>> REQUIREMENTS

Students must be going into 11th (11 credit min.) or 12th grade (17 credit min.) with a minimum of 2.0 grade point average. The school also offers multiple measures of admission. Please call if you have questions.

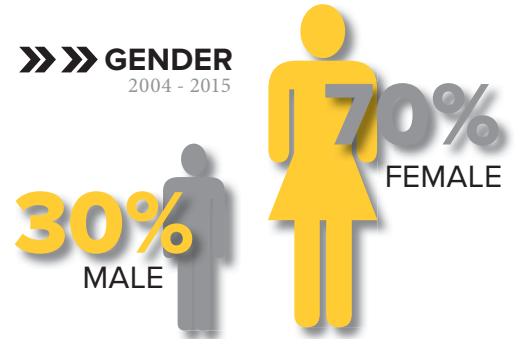

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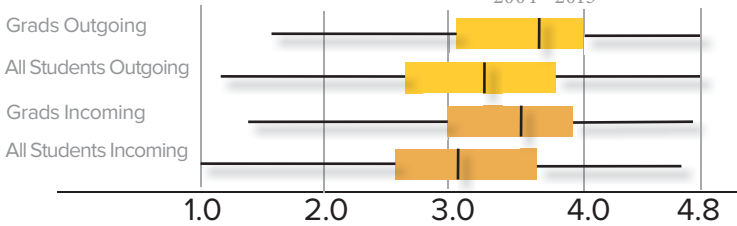
>>> GENDER

2004 - 2015



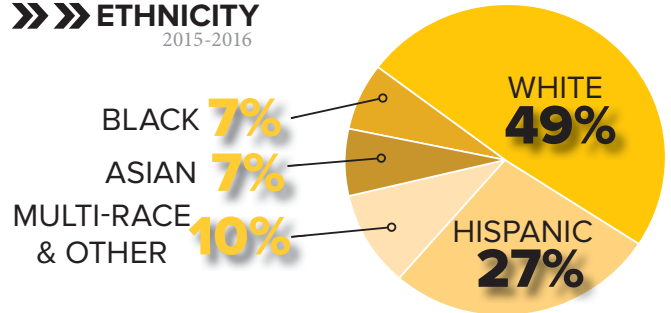
>>> INCOMING AND OUTGOING GPAS

2004 - 2015



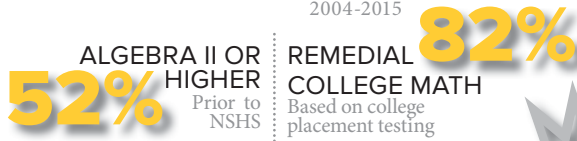
>>> ETHNICITY

2015-2016



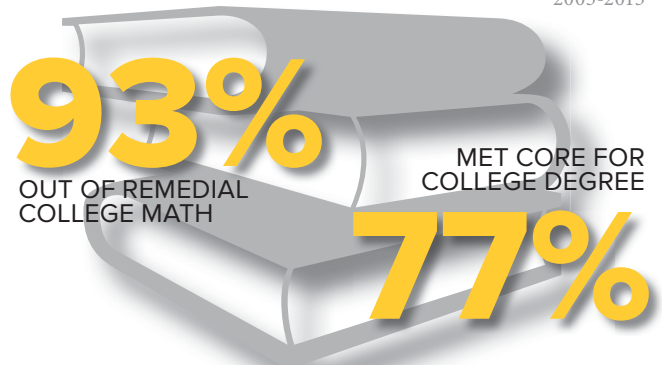
>>> INCOMING MATH LEVELS

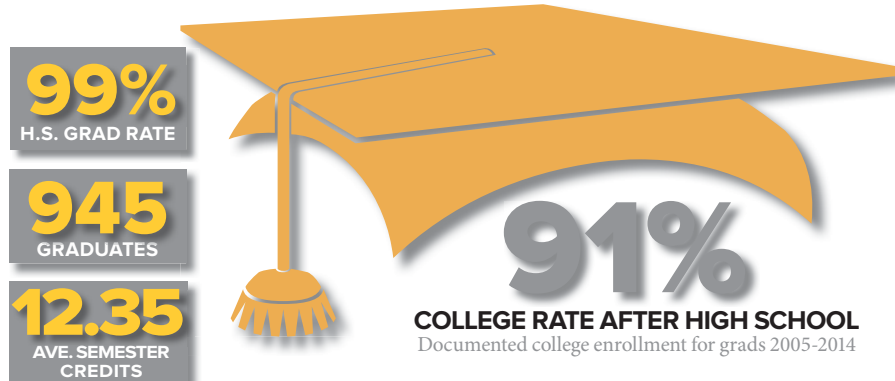
