NSHS is a public school of choice and bound to the intent of the school's charter (NRS 386.500 to 386.610 inclusive). It is crucial that new students and parents are aware of the following disclaimers prior to completing the registration process. The NSHS Student Handbook will be available in August and will detail information on school procedures. Student and parent/guardian acknowledge the following:

1. Understand and agree to follow the school's charter by participating in things that include but are not limited to: college courses, college and career planning, NSHS curriculum, volunteer/social expectations
2. NSHS students are real college students and are treated as such by their college professors in regards to expectations, behavior, parent contact, and adult content. NSHS students must advocate for themselves when interacting with college professors. Parents are not to contact college professors for their children
3. When taking placement tests at CSN, students **MUST** indicate they are a CSN student testing for CSN classes the student will incur any fees from the college that arise from stating they are a high school student
4. Students who complete online enrollment with CSN or GBC and do not enroll with NSHS are subject to all college fees
5. NSHS support for textbooks and educational incidentals:
 - a) Complete the Income Verification (FRL) form at the beginning of the semester and a reimbursement request form by the NSHS deadlines; federal qualification is not required, but it may determine the level of reimbursement
 - b) Textbook purchasing and reimbursement processes are reviewed during NSHS courses and available on MOODLE
 - c) NSHS is required by law to audit (FRL) submissions for those who qualify. Those randomly selected will have one week to submit required documents or reimbursements may be withheld
 - d) Students must maintain enrollment at NSHS through the semester to be eligible for reimbursements
 - e) Students may contact NSHS for any additional financial information
6. Students may **NOT** drop classes without written permission from NSHS, and they are responsible for all course fees
7. NSHS has an Academic Plan that allows for increased college courses as students show success and is initially designed using college placement tests or ACT/SAT scores
8. Students must follow the NSHS Academic Plan for the following courses to maintain enrollment:
 - a) College math every semester (level determined by placement up to approved math exemption)
 - b) College English every semester (level determined by placement up to HS and college completion)
 - c) Social Studies (history HIST 101 & 102 or government PSC 101)
 - d) Intro to College Course (*see unique dates for fall or spring)/other course
 - e) Study Skills every semester (twice a week for two hours)
 - f) Transition Course every semester for 1st year (occurs one Friday a month); COMPASS 2nd years
9. Students are required to complete volunteer service and social activities each semester
- 10 Parent/Guardian agrees to attend one Parent Meeting during the year and check MOODLE announcements regularly
- 11 Activity on MOODLE is monitored by NSHS and students are expected to check it daily
- 12 NSHS holds one carwash fundraiser a year in August. Students have a variety of options for required participation
- 13 Enrollment at NSHS is not guaranteed. Do not withdraw from your previous school until NSHS enrollment is verified
- 14 Students must submit college transcripts to NSHS within 3 days after the end of the semester or receive F's for classes and be billed for the costs of the college courses that may not be voided for late submissions
- 15 Students/parents who withhold or falsify information may be removed from the school or may not be enrolled
- 16 IEP/504 documentation is necessary for college placement tests if students have these services. Students are responsible for setting up these services with the colleges **prior** to testing to ensure any applicable accommodations can be provided by the college for placement testing and in college courses
- 17 Parents will be responsible for picking up student's grades from NSHS after each semester during posted times
- 18 Students must maintain enrollment at NSHS through the semester to be eligible for any reimbursement
- 19 Nevada Law regarding expulsion and truancy are enforced at NSHS
- 20 All students agree to sign up and take the National ACT with writing in the fall semester
- 21 NSHS does **not** have the ability to withdraw a student from **any** college courses. If the student discontinues registration or withdraws from NSHS, the student is ultimately responsible for withdrawing from any and all college courses or they are responsible for college tuition and fees

When a student attends a post-secondary institution, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) allow transfer of privacy rights from the parent to the student regardless of their age. At NSHS, the parent and student must agree to share information with the parent, student, NSHS, and the student's colleges. By enrolling at NSHS, parent and student understand that they are no longer enrolled at a home school, private school, District School, or other charter school. NSHS has permission to obtain educational records from your previous school upon final enrollment.

¹ College placement tests determine math and English classes. Use NSHS flowchart for appropriate class sequence

Classes lower than 100 do not count for college. Math (Prep, 091, 093, 122 or 123) do not count for high school math credit.

² The mandatory Intro to College course is scheduled in mid-August. 2nd year students can take ½ credit of summer school or submit 60 hours of volunteer service to be exempt their 2nd year.

³ Students meeting exemption requirements may request an exemption from Study Skills. Requirements are listed in the student handbook and the Exemption form.

- Students are responsible for meeting all high school graduation requirements as documented in the NSHS Student Handbook
- Students are limited to taking courses at NSC and UNLV. See the NSHS Student Handbook for options
- 11th grade students who are limited to 3 college classes will need to supplement with a high school course
- Students may request an extra course appeal under very limited circumstances per the Extra Course Appeal form and student handbook. Students pay for these courses if approved
- Courses taken outside of the academic course limits outlined on this form and in the student handbook may result in fines
- Students must maintain the legal number of courses by law to maintain enrollment at NSHS - 4 for 12th and 6 for 11th
- Progression to the next level in math and English is dependent upon a C or better
