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# Title: Leadership Best Practices: Mission Measurement and Monitoring Seminar Flyer Leadership Cadre Nevada – Fall 2016 and Spring 2017

#### Seminar Description:

This two-weekend workshop is made up of four seminars and will disseminate Nevada State High School best practices on developing a clear mission that is measurable, reports to stakeholders, and prioritizes intervention practices and develops the capacity of leadership to create new opportunities.

Schools are struggling with how to report their impact on student achievement beyond the state's system that misses the measurement of the school mission, and some may have missions that are so broad that it is unclear their purpose and what they are accomplishing for the communities they serve. To overcome this, grant activities will include seminars for school leadership to discover ways for developing a mission with stakeholders that meet the community's needs, measure their progress on the mission to include implementing a customized school data warehouse, and onsite development training. The workshop will also cover specific assessment tools to help school leaders' better report student achievement growth and targeted interventions.

#### **Seminar Objectives:**

- 1. MISSION: Each participant will walk away from this seminar being trained on a toolkit to lead a staff development day at their site for creating an entire one-page strategic framework on things that include, but are not limited to the following: vision, mission, goal(s), core values, core purpose, and a desired result. The underpinnings to this strategic framework were modeled from Jim Collins book "Good to Great" and his unwavering belief in successful organizations need to preserve the core of their strategic framework while at the same time stimulate progress with a vivid description and a Big Hairy Audacious Goal (BHAG).
- 2. MEASUREMENT: Participants will receive firsthand experience on developing ways to track the progress of every student at their school. The experience will extend to developing an online database to capture, store, and display online dashboards of student progress. This training will showcase importing and exporting data files so that information can successfully linked in a relational database. Finally, participants will learn how to navigate, search, and report on student interventions using the online database.
- 3. MONITORING: This seminar will disseminate best practices regarding implementing a full immersion dual enrollment program partnering with a variety of institutions within the Nevada System of Higher Education. Information will be generalized and participants will learn about ways to monitor, track, and support students through a successful milestone transitions in their life pre k to ES, ES to MS, MS to HS, HS to college, and college into career/community. In conclusion, participants will learn about placement testing, classroom support, student monitoring, interventions, and more. The objective is that participants will be able to walk away from this session with a toolkit for customizing their own unique school programs.
