NOTE: By State law, students must adhere to the required number of courses by grade level (6 classes for 11th & non-college/career ready 12th; 4 classes for approved college/career ready 12th) including mandatory classes as outlined in the Academic Plan each semester or will be considered a non-enrolled student. It is the student's responsibility to maintain the number of classes.

- College placement tests determine math and English classes. Use college flowchart for appropriate class sequence. Classes lower than 100 do not count for college.
- The mandatory Intro to College course is scheduled in mid-August. 2nd year students can pay to take ½ credit of summer school, a college course, or submit 60 hours of volunteer service to be exempt their 2nd year.
- Students meeting exemption requirements may request an exemption from Study Skills. Requirements are listed in the student handbook, CAP, and the Exemption form.
- Green/Yellow juniors only with no D/F's eligible for 5 college courses + the 1 credit ECON in spring for the high school graduation requirement
 - Students are responsible for meeting all high school graduation requirements as documented in the NSHS Student Handbook
 - Students are limited to taking courses at NSC, TMCC, WNC, UNLV, and UNR. See the NSHS Student Handbook for options
 - 11th grade and non-CCR 12th grade students who are limited to 3 college classes will need to supplement with a high school course
 - Students may request an extra course appeal under very limited circumstances per the Extra Course Appeal form and student handbook. Students pay for these courses if approved by NSHS in writing
 - Courses taken outside of the academic course limits outlined on this form and in the student handbook may result in college course charges
 - Students must maintain the legal number of courses by law to maintain enrollment at NSHS - 4 for approved 12th and 6 for 11th & non-college/career ready 12th
 - Progression to the next level in math and English is dependent upon a C or better (not C-)
 - The student must align college courses towards a degree and college transferability
