Remedial courses:

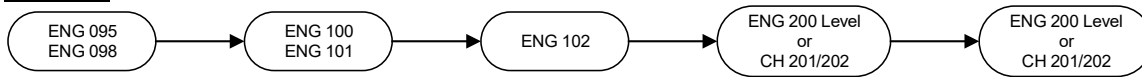
- Includes any college course under 100 level

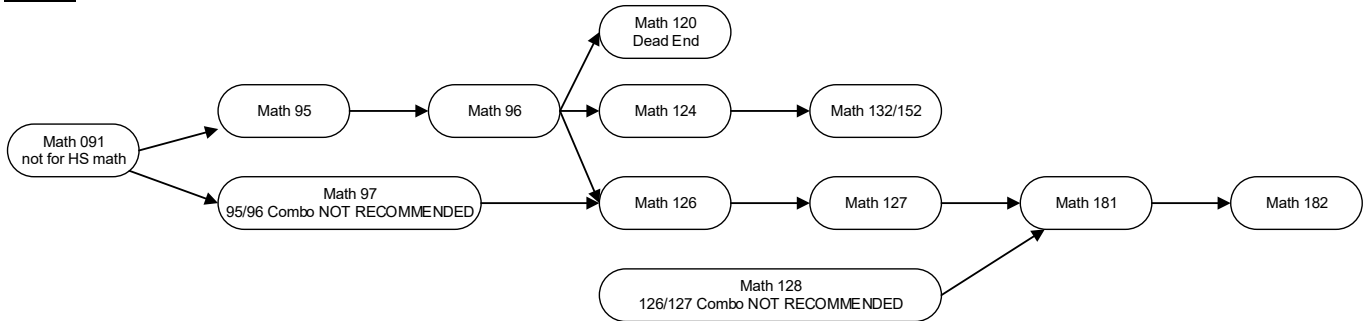
The following flow charts provide information to guide college planning. The following should be considered:

1. NSHS Academic Plan course limitations and credits
2. Current high school credit situation, completing HS requirements first, and remedial needs
3. Requirements for an Associate's Degree (if you may pursue one)
4. Specific requirements for their chosen Bachelor's Degree at a specific college
5. Math 120/124 are dead-end math courses that does not fulfill pre-requisite requirements for higher courses nor do they fulfill the NSHS remediation requirement for graduation. Students can only take this course if they place directly into Math 126 (not Math 126E) or higher, or pass Math 96 with a C or higher (not C-).
6. Note: Flow is pending each college's outlined path per course catalog prerequisites

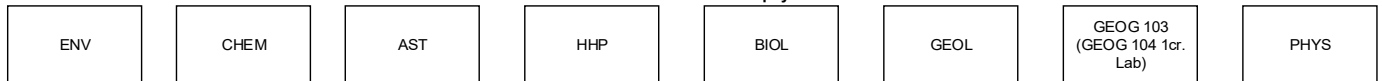
English: See degree plan to determine ENG 200 level or CH 201/202

Science Options: Social science classes do not fulfill science for HS or college. Students need to plan for a minimum of 2 college sciences courses, one of which has a lab. Labs taken without a lecture do not count for HS credit or class count and students must pay for it.

Electives: When space is available in the academic plan, plan for college core and transferable courses. See college catalog, which could include:
